Liberal action in Devon.

In Devon, the Silverton Room 4 U project is progressing well. Councillor Jenny Roach is Chairman of the group, which is aiming to set up a Health and Well-being centre for the village. They have been raising funds for two years and now have enough money to purchase the building.

In this photo they can be seen celebrating the fact that they have been granted charitable status. The large poster being pinned to the door of the toilet block includes a copy of the registration document. Jenny said, "People are being very generous and supportive, we now have £54k raised or promised."

Stop Press.

Councillor Lloyd Knight, A Bradninch Town Councillor has just joined the Liberal Party. Lloyd is well known in Bradninch and has a reputation as a hard working and caring councillor. Jenny Roach, who enrolled Lloyd, said she was very pleased to welcome Lloyd to The Liberal Party and she was looking forward to campaigning with him to rebuild the Liberal Party in Devon.

Persistence rewarded after Labour Council failure. For years Tuebrook has been blighted by small waste land sites subject to dumping. Tuebrook Librals have worked to get the

City Council to use its Compulsory Purchase powers to consolidate ownership of these small sites, then sell them to local builders. This ensures new houses being built and helps to create extra construction jobs. All of this has been a struggle with the Labour Council and Mayor who favour grand schemes and opportunities to blame everyone from the government to local residents rather than working on grass roots solutions. Just another victory for the Liberal way.

Recycling Centre finally opens. After 3 years lobbying by Liberal Party Councillors residents in the East of Liverpool have their own recycling centre at Cheadle Avenue, Old Swan. Cllr Steve Radford says "it is vital for our work to increase recycling and reduce fly-tipping so to have a local centre for people and traders is a major improvement. This is a victory for the environment and a key measure if the City is not to be financially broken by Westminster/EU land-fill taxes."


