Environment Policy Motion - Climate Change



The Liberal Party acknowledges that there is now little doubt that we humans, along with most other species on the planet, will face the most challenging time in recorded history during the remainder of this century – and that challenge for each species will be survival.

Opportunities to stand as a Liberal Candidate.

John Hein – Liberal Party NEC member passed away after a short illness at the end of 2020

The Liberal Party is sad to learn of the passing on 23rd December of Edinburgh' Pride founder, LGBTQ rights and Liberal Party campaigner, John Hein.

John was a passionate and dedicated campaigner for the Liberal cause. Once Chair of the Liberal Party and ongoing Liberal Party Executive Committee member, he stood for the Liberal Party in Westminster parliamentary elections in Tweeddale Ettrick and Lauderdale (1992, 1997, 2001), Roxburgh and Selkirk (2005) and Edinburgh North And Leith (2010); in European Parliamentary elections for South of Scotland (1994); in Scottish Parliamentary elections for South of Scotland (1999) and Lothians (2003); and in City of Edinburgh Council elections for New Town (2003) and Leith Walk (2007, 2012).

His dedication to the causes he believed in through political activism and in his contribution to the communities in which he lived, often against all the odds, are a testament to his conviction and faith in the human spirit.

Władysława Gerlowska-Poole (Vicki) 1951-2020

It is with much regret that the Cornish Liberals report the death of one of its most loyal supporters known to us all as Vicki Poole.



Vicki was born in a Polish Refugee Camp in Wales; both her parents were Polish. Her father fought in the Polish Army in WWII and her mother was forced to work for the German occupying forces. Her mother escaped and made her way to the UK as a refugee.

Vicki started at the local school at five and learnt English. Leaving school, she moved to Seaton in South Devon working in hotels and married a local boy who was in the Royal Navy. She was active in the Liberal Party in Seaton. When her husband was posted to RNAS Yeovilton, they moved to Somerton in Somerset. She was active in the Liberal Party there and worked hard in Yeovil for Paddy Ashdown. In the early 1980s Vicki moved

to St Illogan in Cornwall, joining the local Liberal Party. In 1988 when the Liberal Democrats were formed, she refused to join them and along with a group of loyal Liberals stayed with the original Liberal Party and helped reform the Cornish Liberal Party. Vicki was elected to Illogan Parish Council and was a member for over 20 years before ill-health forced her retirement. Vicki was Council Chairman in 2007/8. She was also a member the Liberal Party National Executive for 16 years, travelling to London to meetings and regularly attended the Party's Annual Assemblies around the country. In 2019 she was presented with a certificate for 50 years of loyal support to the Liberal Party.

When Vicki was 16 her eyesight began to fail and eventually she lost most of her sight. Later in life other disabilities meant Vicki needed the use of a wheelchair. Despite all this Vicki was alert with a fantastic sense of humour and never took prisoners when debating issues at Council meetings or even when chairing local Liberal Party meetings. Vicki caught an infection and died at Royal Cornwall Hospital, Truro. Our sympathies are with her daughter, Zoe.
